Dear Ministry Partner,

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ! Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ (Eph. 1:2). We thank you so much for your constant prayers and financial support to bring the good news of Jesus Christ to millions of people in India. We are now entering the 15th year of our ministry and for the last 14 years, the Lord has been so good and faithful for the ministry.

During this last trip to India, I had the opportunity to meet with some of the graduates of Kerala Theological Seminary and hear about what they are doing. Vijay Raju is one of our graduates currently working as a church planter in the state of Andhra Pradesh. He was born and raised in a Hindu family. Through some miraculous healings in his family, his parents came to know Jesus Christ and accepted Him as Savior and Lord. Despite the transformation in his parents' lives, Vijay was not able to fully accept Christ as Lord of his life. He had many questions about the faith of his parents, which ultimately led him to read the Bible. God spoke to Vijay through His word and he decided to commit his life to Christ. He heard about KTS and came to study in the Bachelor of Theology program. Like many of our students, he was not able to speak a single word in English when he came to KTS. But by the grace of God, he was able to learn English at KTS and is now able to communicate the gospel in both Telugu (his native language) and English. Vijay planted four churches in his home state and has 500 people attending the worship services on Sunday. God has blessed this young man's ministry in such a short time, and there are many other KTS graduates just like him who are making a strong impact in India for God's kingdom.

The 12th graduation of Kerala Theological Seminary was held on February 15, 2014. Thirty students graduated and received Bibles and bicycles for the ministry. Nearly 300 graduates are now serving the Lord in different parts of India. Twenty-five poor women were given sewing machines that will help them earn a living for their families. Forty poor children were given financial support for their education.

We also had three women join the seminary for their studies this year. Unfortunately, we could not accept more women into the seminary because of a lack of facilities to house them. In order to accept more women, we want to construct new dormitories. There is also a need for sponsorship of missionaries, pastors, faculty and students of KTS. Please prayerfully consider partnering with us to meet these needs.

It is because of your prayer and sacrificial giving that we are able to make a great impact among the lost millions of India. Together we can win the people of India for Jesus Christ. All of us here at Kerala Theological Seminary and Agape Care Center would like to thank you so much for your valuable prayers and support. May God bless you and reward you a hundred-fold.
